## Dichotomous Key for common Florida saltwater fish

1a 1b	Tail is long, whip-like  Tail is fan-shaped or forked	
2a 2b	Body is covered in scales	
3a 3b	Upper portion of tail is much larger than lower portion of tail Upper and lower portions of tail are symmetrical	
4a 4b	Head is pointed Head is rounded; shovel-shaped	
5a 5b	Fish has silvery/reflective coloration	
6a 6b	Fish has dark spot on gill cover and at base of pectoral fin	
7a 7b	Body is longer than it is deep, symmetrical top to bottom	
8a 8b	Tail is fan shaped	
9a 9b	First and second dorsal fins are fused	
10a 10b	Fish has vertical stripes	
11a 11b	Anal fin and second dorsal fin are enlarged and tapering	
12a 12b	First dorsal fin has 10 fin rays	
13a 13b	Fish has multiple spots on body, dorsal and caudal fins	-
14a 14b	Fish has a single dorsal fin.  Fish has first and second dorsal fins (may be fused).	
15a 15b	Fish has vertical bars on its body	

16a	Fish has dark spot above pectoral fin	. Pinfish
16b	Fish has no spots, only stripes	. Sheepshead
17a	Fish has single dark stripe along its lateral line	. Snook
17b	Fish has multiple horizontal stripes	Striped mullet
